Load In/Parking:

- For full day or two day workshops it is encouraged to arrive Friday night to settle in between 6 and 8 P.M. If need earlier or later please call the coordinator so we can leave a light on for you.
- If arriving the day of, please arrive 1 hour before start time
- Please park your trailer & truck in the designated area; pull forward into the driveway, we will then guide you to your designated spot (Tom will gladly park your trailer if you need).
 - \circ 110v electric available to horse trailers via extension cord
- Always be mindful that as you arrive with your horse, people may be riding/playing with their horses, so please be courteous when checking in.
- Leave your vehicle unlocked with key available on dash or console in case vehicle needs moved in an emergency.
- Participants are required to use the same horse throughout the workshop

Check In:

- check in with the coordinator when you arrive
- at check-in you will need:
 - a copy of a current coggins & health certificate <u>if you are travelling from out of state</u>
 - a signed copy of the liability release agreements if you have not already sent it or have it on file
 final payment due

Workshop Times:

- You don't want to miss a thing so <u>be ready before 9:00 A.M</u>.
- We will meet without horses on day one at 9:00
- Finish time will be approximately 4:00 p.m.

Stalls/Tie:

- stalls and paddocks available. Coordinate paddock use with the coordinator.
- Write your name, cell number, and horse's name on the marker board for stalls or outdoor paddocks so we can find you if needed.
- Use any stall with an open door in the north isle way.
- There is a guest tack room in the north isle way.
- Horses may be tied in the indoor arena.
 - Ask Tom for savvy tying tips.
 - Do not tie near the cutting flag wires.
- Participants are responsible for cleaning their stall/tie/paddocks the entire duration of the workshop.
- no portable pens or tying horses to trailer overnight.
- BYO hay, shavings and water bucket (we'll have shavings for purchase \$6 bag, hay \$6 bale)
- Barn water spigot is near the office. Feel free to run hose.
- Manure goes in the manure dump trailer
- When you depart
 - \circ ~ leave your stall manure free and all wet shavings removed, but not stripped.
 - rinse /dump water buckets

- o leave paddocks manure free
- Rates for Stalls and Camping
 - Camping \$20 per night
 - Paddock / Stalls \$10 per day (free with paid workshop)

Clothing:

• Please wear comfortable clothing/proper riding apparel. Proper footwear is required for all riders (rider boot with heel). Helmets are required for anyone under 18. Helmets are encouraged for everyone.

Equipment and Other Items to Bring:

- Please label all your tack and equipment with your name.
 - All of the following items would be helpful to bring to the workshop:
 - Carrot Stick and String (extra savvy string in your pocket and pocket knife recommend)
 - Halter and 12' Line and 22' Line
 - Level 3-4: 45' Line, optional 22' Feather Lines
 - Bareback pad (optional)
 - Bridle with non leverage snaffle, cradle or natural hackamore (check with Tom if you're not sure)
 - Saddle, cinches, pad and shims if you have them (limited Parelli saddles available to try out)
 - Grooming equipment
 - Horsenality Chart, filled out (optional)
 - Please bring your own hay, grain, feed pans and water bucket, etc...

Food:

- For 2 day workshops
 - plan on meeting at 6:00 P.M. for a group dinner on Saturday night.
 - o breakfast/lunch are on your own
 - Box lunch available by pre-order with the coordinator
 - We recommend packing your lunch so you can use your lunch break to relax
 - o Microwave/water/coffee available in the barn office, help yourself
- Bring lots of water for yourself. It's easy to get dehydrated.

Stallions/Dogs

- Stallions are not permitted in the workshop or on the property
- There are dogs on the premises; however your dog is not welcome.

Smoking:

This is a non-smoking facility. Smoking is permitted on the house patio deck and screened in porch only

Staying at the House:

- Guest wireless network password: horseplay (the entire property has wireless signal)
- Bring your own towels and toiletries. We'll have extras.

Participant Fees and Cancellation Policy

- 50% deposit or payment in full holds your spot.
- Half of the workshop fee will be charged if a participant must back out of the workshop prior to two weeks before the start date of the workshop. The total workshop fee will be charged if it is within two weeks before the workshop. Neither of the fees will apply if a replacement is found by either the

participant or workshop coordinator. If there is a medical reason or family emergency the fees can be held in deposit and used for a future workshop spot/private lessons etc. if a replacement is not found.

 For winter events, the instructor and host will make the decision to cancel 24 hrs. in advance. For winter workshops with horses, if the daytime high temperature is forecast to be below 20 degrees fahrenheit, we will cancel the workshop. Otherwise, plan for the weather.

Workshop Pre-requisites:

- <u>Level 1:</u> We will present concepts and skills as presented in the home study course. The more you know and practice from the savvy club....the more you get out of the workshops! The basic Parelli equipment kit is helpful; carrot stick, string, halter, 12 foot line.
- <u>Level 2 and Advancing Level 2</u>: A thorough understanding of the basic concepts and skills as presented in the home study pack is expected. You are not required to have attended a Level 1 workshop but a thorough understanding of the basic concepts and skills as presented in the home study pack is expected.
- <u>Level 3 and Advancing Level 3:</u> You are required to have attended a Level 2 workshop and have selfassessed through the Parelli level 2 Home study courses. At a minimum, confidence in the Walk and Trot are expected to help in increasing your development into canter for most.
- <u>Level 4:</u> You are required to have attended a Level 3 workshop and have self-assessed through the Parelli level 3 Home study courses. At a minimum, confidence in the Walk, Trot and Canter are expected.
