Load In/Parking:

- For multi day clinics it is encouraged to arrive the night before to settle in, preferably between 4:00-6:00 PM. If need earlier or later please call the coordinator so we can leave a light on for you.
- If arriving the day of, please arrive 1 hour before start time.
- Do not unload any horses until you have checked in with Tom and all paperwork has been signed/submitted.
- Please park your trailer & truck in the designated area; pull forward into the driveway, we will then guide you to your designated spot (Tom will gladly park your trailer if you need).
 - 30 amp and 120v electric available
- Always be mindful that as you arrive with your horse, people may be riding/playing with their horses, so please be courteous when checking in.
- Leave your vehicle unlocked with key available on dash or console in case vehicle needs moved in an emergency.
- Participants are required to use the same horse throughout.
- The main gate will be open for check in. Once everyone is in, the gate will be closed. It automatically opens towards you and will stay open for you on the way out. We will give you a re-entry code. Press the buttons firmly and all codes start with the # key.

Check In:

- check in with the coordinator when you arrive.
- at check-in you will need:
 - a copy of a current coggins if you are travelling from out of state
 - State of Ohio requires health certificate and coggins for all out of state travelers but we only need to see your out of state coggins paperwork.
 - a signed copy of the liability release and clinic registration if you have not already sent it in.
 - final payment is due
 - do not unload any horse until you've checked in with Tom
- On the wall entering the barn is a clip board with your clinic tab, and any paperwork needing to be signed. Leave all paperwork, tab, and final payment on the clip board.

Clinic/Workshop Times:

- For clinics be ready before 9:00 A.M.
 - We will meet without horses on day one at 9:00 A.M.
 - Finish time will be approximately 4:00 P.M.
- For the morning meeting, please have your horse fed and ready, tied to the wall in the arena at your tack station. There are Blocker Tie Rings at each station. See Tom if you're unfamiliar with the Blocker Tie Ring system.

Stalls/Tie:

- Stalls and/or paddocks are available. Coordinate paddock use with the coordinator.
- Write your name, cell number, and horse's name on the marker board for stalls and outdoor paddocks so we can find you if needed.
- Use any stall with an open door in the north aisle way.
- There is a guest tack room in the north aisle way, but it is closed due to COVID19.

- Saddles, tack, ropes, etc can be stored at your tack station in the arena
- Store feed, other tack, and the like in your vehicle or select an open stall
- Participants are responsible for cleaning their stall/tie/paddocks the entire duration of the event.
 - On the last day you may pay to have your paddock/stall cleaned, \$25 on your tab
- no portable pens or tying horses to trailer overnight.
- BYO hay, shavings and water bucket (we'll have shavings for purchase \$6 bag, hay \$6 bale)
- Barn water spigot is near the office. Feel free to run hose.
- Manure goes in the manure dump trailer,
 - push/pile it all the way up to the front of the trailer
- When you depart
 - leave your stall/paddock manure free and all wet shavings removed.
 - Err on the side of striping the stall
 - feel free to leave clean/dry shavings for the next person, but only pristine clean shavings please
 - rinse /dump water buckets
 - pay any remaining charges from your tab, leaving on clip board
- Rates for Stalls and Camping
 - Camping \$20 per night
 - Stalls/paddocks free

Clothing:

- Please wear comfortable clothing/proper riding apparel. Proper footwear is required for all riders (rider boot with heel). Helmets are required for anyone under 18. Helmets are encouraged for everyone.

Equipment and Other Items to Bring:

- Please label all your tack and equipment with your name.
- All of the following items would be helpful to bring:
 - Carrot Stick and String (extra savvy string in your pocket and pocket knife recommend)
 - Halter and 12' Line and 22' Line
 - Level 3-4: 45' Line, optional 22' Feather Lines
 - Bareback pad (optional)
 - Bridle with non leverage snaffle, cradle or natural hackamore (check with Tom if you're not sure)
 - Saddle, cinches, pad and shims if you have them (limited Parelli saddles available to try out)
 - Grooming equipment
 - Horsenality Chart, filled out (optional)

Food:

- For Multi Day Clinics:
 - Dinner:
 - Let's meet for optional BYO dinner at 6:30 nightly, either on the patio or in the arena if bad weather
 - Byo dinner and drinks so we can still gather together with social distancing.
 - Door Dash and Uber Eats do a great job.
 - Breakfast
 - You're on your own for breakfast.
 - Lunch
 - For 2 day clinics, Dorothy Lane Market Box lunch are available by pre-order. They're fantastic.
 - The order gets phoned in around 7:00 PM the night before.
 - There is a menu on your clipboard or see Mike/Tom to put in your order
 - The killer brownies are scrumpselicious.
 - Otherwise we recommend packing your lunch so you can use your lunch break to relax
 - Microwave/water/coffee available in the barn office, help yourself
 - There is a refrigerator in the house garage if you need
- Bring lots of water for yourself. It's easy to get dehydrated.

Pictures/Video:

- Take as many still photos or video as you like. Any video you take is for private personal use only. Do not post any video to social media without Tom's approval.

Stallions/Dogs

- Stallions are not permitted on the property
- There are dogs on the premises; however your dog is not welcome.

Smoking:

This is a non-smoking facility. Smoking is permitted on the house patio deck and screened in porch only

- Guest wireless network password: Horseplay (the entire property has wireless signal)
- Bring your own towels and toiletries.
- We provide bedding.
- Bring a bathing suit and towel for the hot tub/pool
- Leave your bed unmade when you leave.
- Refrigerator space available in the garage.

Participant Fees and Cancellation Policy

50% deposit or payment in full holds your spot. Full payment is due two weeks before an event and is non-refundable unless a replacement participant is found

Pre-requisites:

- Level 1: We will present concepts and skills as presented in the home study course. The more you know and practice from the savvy club the better. The basic Parelli equipment kit is helpful; carrot stick, string, halter, 12 foot line.
- Level 2 and Advancing Level 2: A thorough understanding of the basic concepts and skills as presented in the home study pack is expected. You are not required to have attended a Level 1 clinic but a thorough understanding of the basic concepts and skills as presented in the home study pack is expected.
- Level 3 and Advancing Level 3: You are required to have attended a Level 2 clinic and have self-assessed through the Parelli level 2 Home study courses. At a minimum, confidence in the Walk and Trot are expected to help in increasing your development into canter for most.
- Level 4: You are required to have attended a Level 3 clinic and have self-assessed through the Parelli level 3 Home study courses. At a minimum, confidence in the Walk, Trot and Canter are expected.
